



„100 years of Scouting“ – We celebrate

1) WHAT are we planning to do?

Due to the celebration of **100 years of Scouting**, the Scouts of Bruck/Leitha are initiating an international **event** aimed at the participation of at least 100 Slovak, Hungarian and Austrian Scouts in the region of our home town.

At this event we are going to celebrate **100 years of Scouting**. We try to bring together Scouts of the region as well as connect them to our local population.

In general, the program is intended for Boy Scouts and Girl Guides starting from the age of 13 (equivalent to the Austrian Boy Scouts and Girl Guides (PPÖ) age groups

Caravelles/Explorer (13-16 years of age) and Ranger/Rover (16-20 years of age)). We also

want to encourage Non-Scouts and younger Scouts to participate in this event as visitors.

All this is going to start on **September, 29th 2007**, **city centre (Hauptplatz) of Bruck an der Leitha**.



2) Who the heck knows Bruck an der Leitha?

The district's capital is situated between vineyards and the forests of the Leitha mountains. Not only the nature lover, but also people interested in culture and history will find a lot to do.



Bruck an der Leitha combines history and the conveniences of a modern small town in a lovely manner. You will find beautifully renovated historic buildings, nice restaurants and romantic wine cellars. Promenaders will enjoy the park which was converted into an “English garden” in the 18th century and surrounds the old castle Prugg.

The well developed infrastructure of the city offers thousands of people a variety of jobs and leisure activities.

Museums and the old town including Kirchengasse (Church Street) as the oldest street in the city centre are nice sightseeing and shopping places.

Whoever wants to enjoy a metropolis does not spend a long time on getting to Vienna. You can reach Bruck an der Leitha quite easily on the motorway A4 or by the excellent bus- and train connections.

Also the Neusiedler See (Lake of Neusiedl) is just a hop away.

3) WHAT precisely is going to happen?

Our group will make this gathering a terrific one for all participating Boy Scouts and Girls Guides of Austria, Slovakia and Hungary.

The official part of this one-day event comprises a **morning** and **afternoon** programme.

In the morning there will be a variety of workshops open for Non-Scouts and interested people as well. The participants are going to present parts of their country, their culture, their food or their language at this occasion.

After **lunch** the **afternoon programme** will commence. A vast outdoor game taking place in

different locations

spread all over the city

and the nearby park

will be the highlight of the day. There will be a

challenging task which can only be solved by

putting together aspects of all the participants' linguistic and cultural backgrounds. For this

reason participants are

mixed together in small groups to better get to

know each other and to experience how to solve

tasks in an international community. The **official end** will take place in the city centre, where the

solution to the task will be presented.

After the official end of the programme there will be a **barbecue in our Scout centre** for the

participants to relax and deepen their new friendships.

5) WHERE does it take place and WHERE is the meeting point?

The event will take place in the city centre of Bruck/Leitha, the main square.



It will be our meeting point, the place where all activities will start from and where the closing event will take place.
